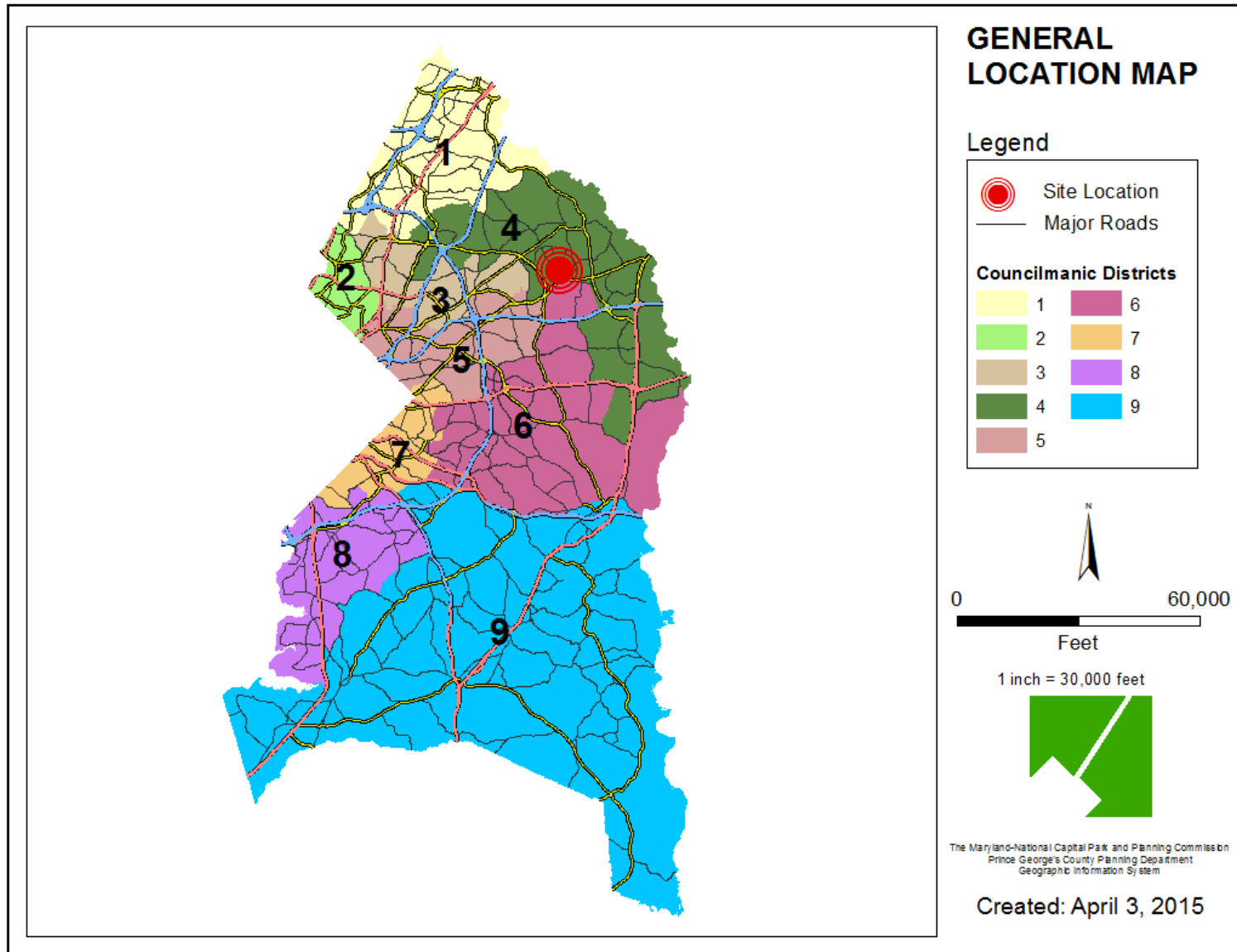

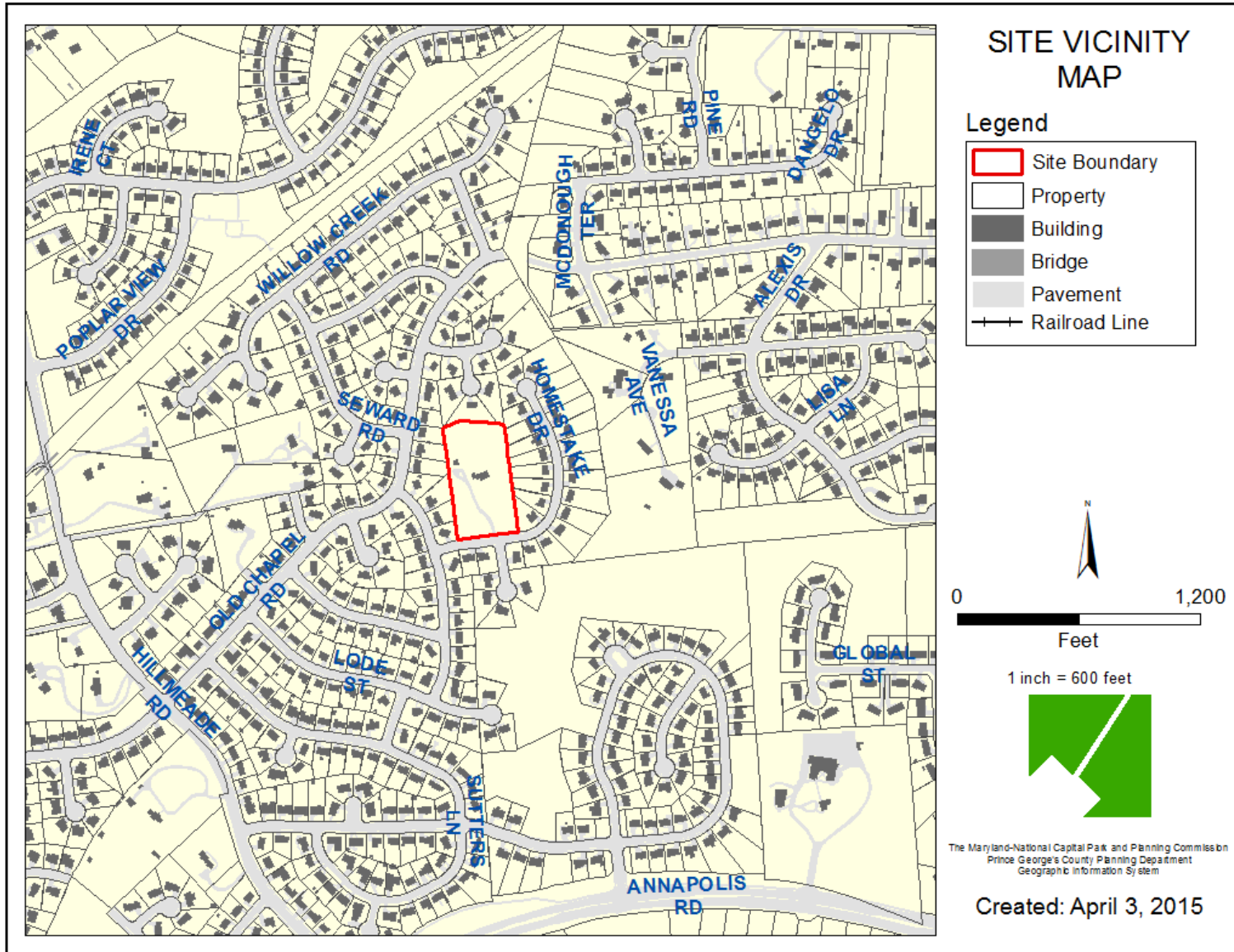

ADDISON'S ADDITION TO CEDAR HILL

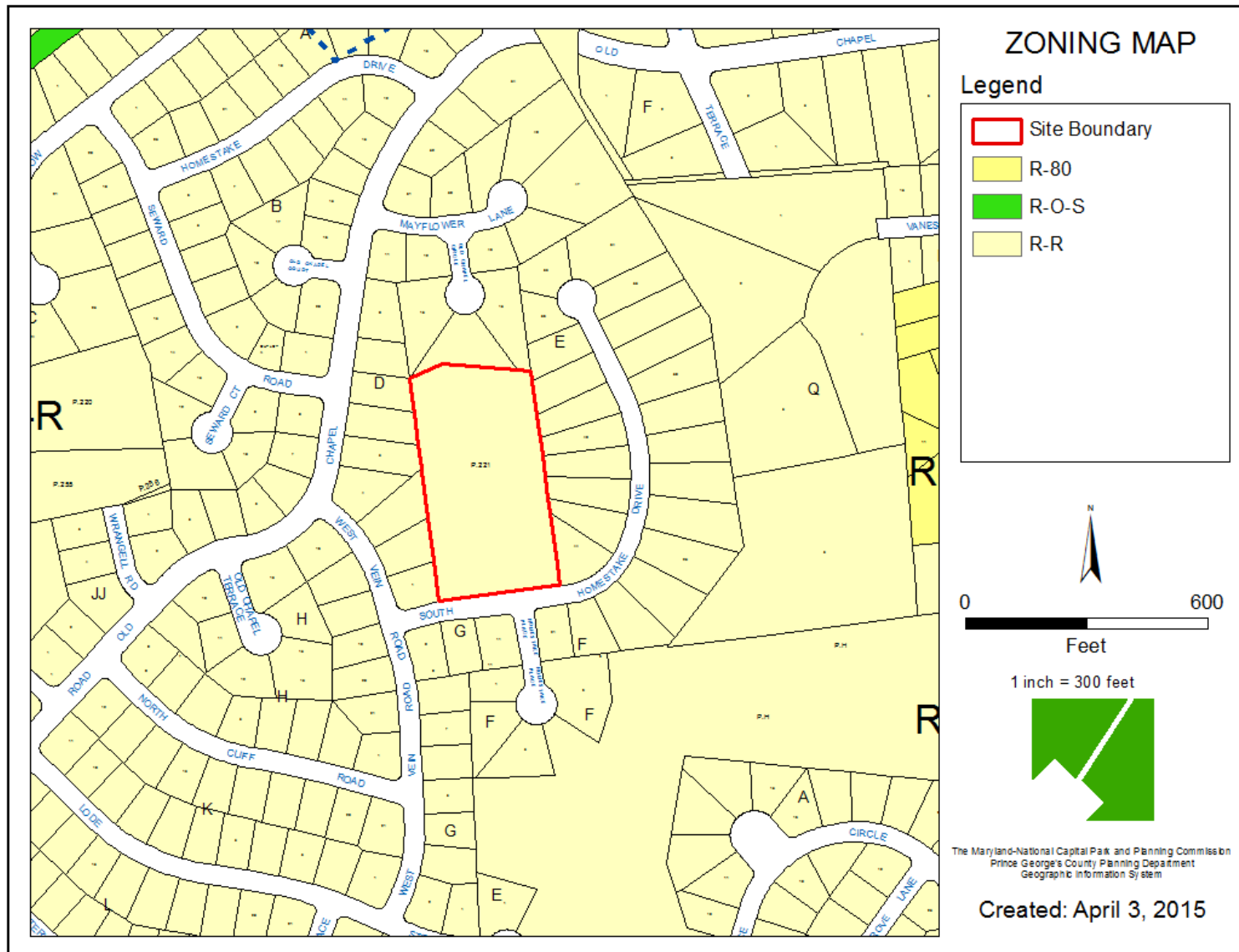
GENERAL LOCATION MAP



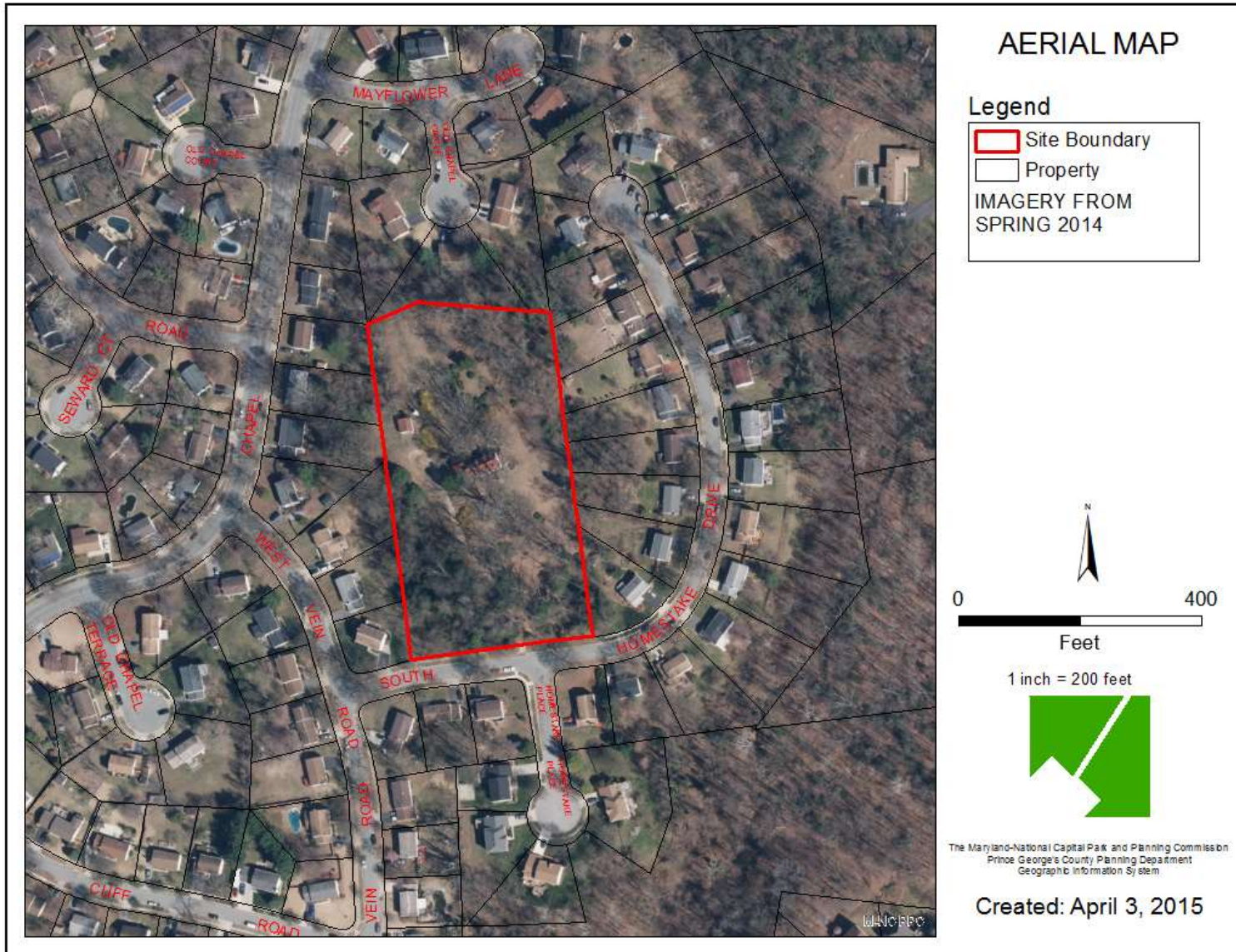
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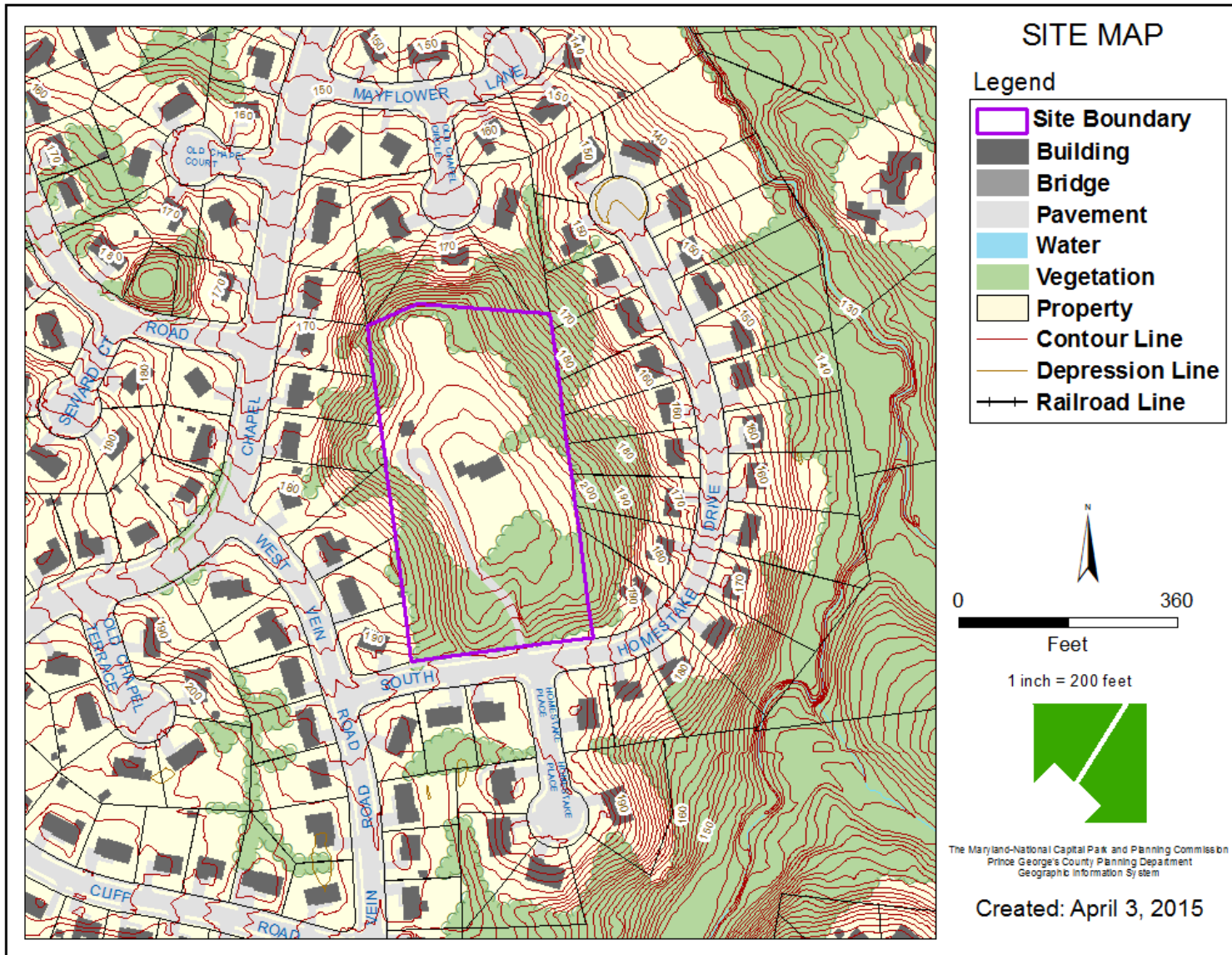
ZONING MAP



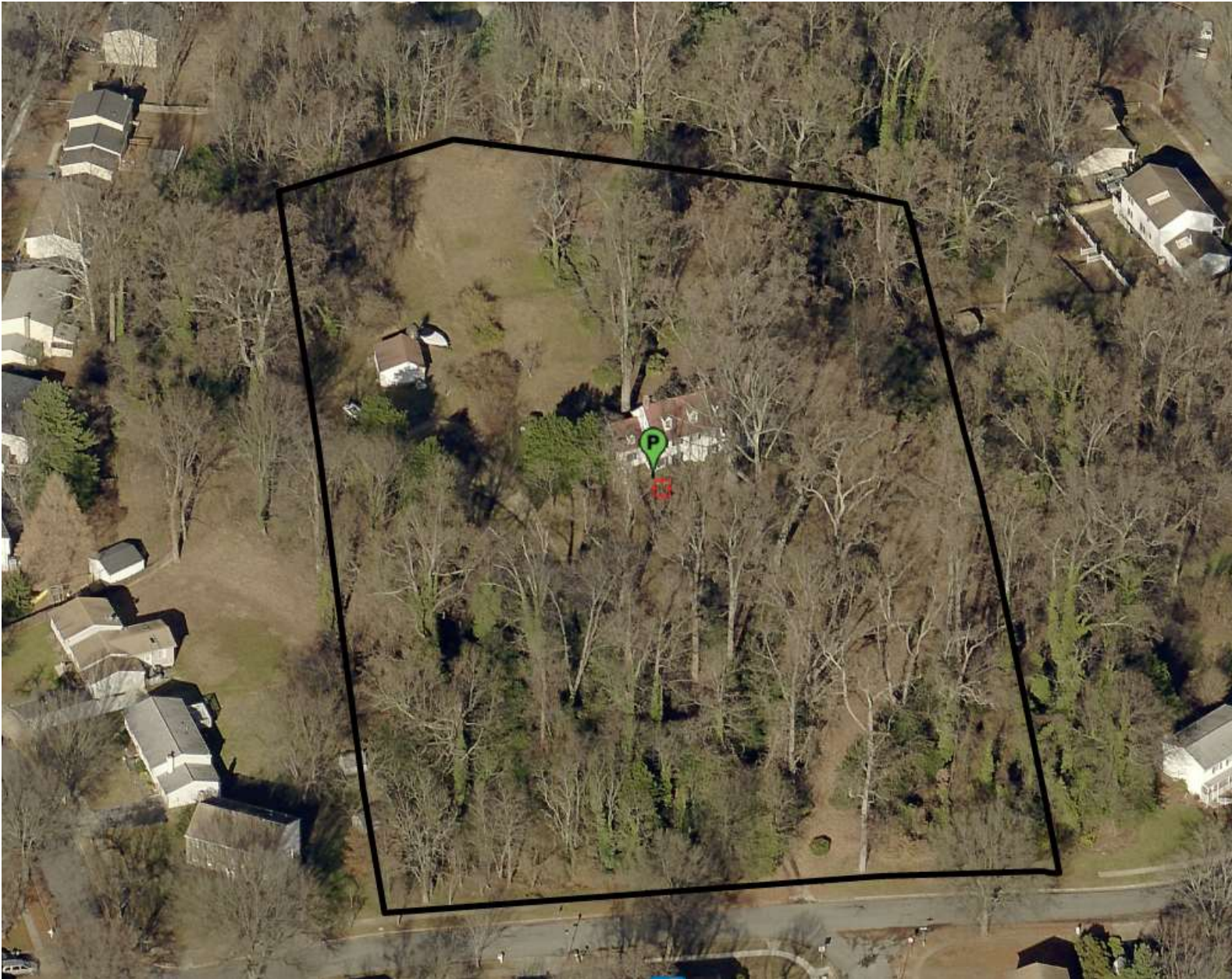

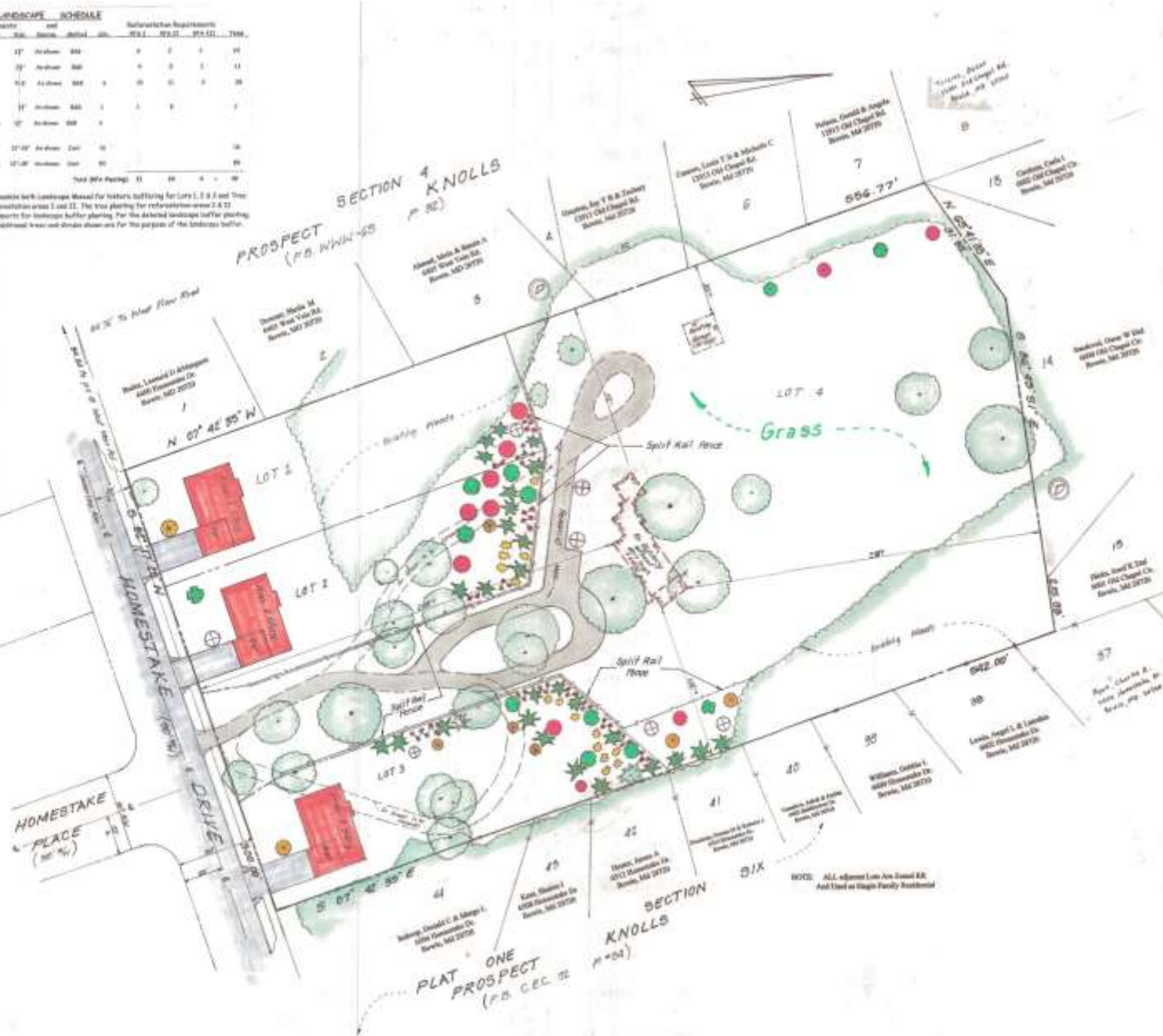
BIRD'S-EYE VIEW WITH APPROXIMATE SITE BOUNDARY OUTLINED
