RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2001, a petition was filed by Joe and Rosa Gomes for the vacation of 6,803 square feet of Weed Avenue in the subdivision of Wildercroft, such petition, accompanying plat and plat of computation being attached to this Resolution to be considered a part of the Resolution; and

WHEREAS, on or about early 1900's, said street, thirty feet (30') in width, was created as a public street as part of a subdivision known as Wildercroft, all situated in the 19th Election District in Prince George's County; and

WHEREAS, the Wildercroft Subdivision appears on a plat recorded in Plat Book RNR2, Plat 11, all among the Land Records of Prince George's County, Maryland; and

WHEREAS, upon consideration of the Petition for Vacation filed herein pursuant to Section 24-112 of the Subdivision Regulations, Prince George's County Code, and it appearing that the petitioners are the owners of all land abutting said street to be vacated; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid application, also known as Vacation Petition V-01002, was presented to the Prince George's County Planning Board of The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission by the staff of the Commission on April 19, 2001, for its review and action in accordance with the Regulations for the Subdivision of Land, Subtitle 24, Prince George's County; and

WHEREAS, it appears that signs have been posted on the premises for at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of this action; and

WHEREAS, the staff of The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission recommended APPROVAL of the Petition; and

WHEREAS, on April 19, 2001, the Prince George's County Planning Board heard testimony and received evidence submitted for the record on the aforesaid application.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to the provisions of Subtitle 24, Subdivision Regulations, Prince George's County Code, it is hereby directed by the Prince George's County Planning Board that the public street be vacated and reconverted into undivided tracts, parcels of land or acreage subject to the following conditions:

1. Recordation of a subdivision plat in accordance with Preliminary Plan 4-99010.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be directed to the Clerk of the Court, Prince George County, Maryland to note upon the subject plats the fact of this vacation and that the findings and reasons for the decision of the Planning Board are as follows:

1. The public utilities and Prince George*s County have been notified of this petition as required by Section 24-112(e) of the Subdivision Regulaitons

- 2. The Department of Public Works and Transportation and the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission have consented to this petition as required by Section 24-112(e)(1) of the Subdivision Regulations.
- 3. No referral agency or department recommended disapproval of the petition.
- 4. No objections were received from adjacent property owners.
- 5. Petitioners are the owners of all land abutting street proposed to be vacated.
- 6. It is the applicant intention to prepare a new subdivision plat in accordance with Preliminary Plan 4-99010 to incorporate the vacated area into four residential lots.
