**Dobson Farms** 

By letter dated August 19, 2025, Brandywine/TB, Southern Region Neighborhood Coalition ("BTB") requested the Prince George's County Planning Board reconsider its approval of Preliminary Plan of Subdivision (PPS) 4 24014. The PPS was approved on July 10, 2025, and the resolution memorializing the approval (PGCPB Resolution No. 2025-059) was adopted by the Planning Board on July 31, 2025. Per Section 8.4 of the Planning Board's Rules of Procedure, the Board may only adopt a motion of reconsideration if, in furtherance of substantial public interest, the Planning Board finds there was an error in reaching its original decision that was caused by fraud, surprise, mistake, or inadvertence.

A petition for judicial review of the Planning Board's action on the PPS was filed with the Circuit Court for Prince George's County (Case No. C-16-CV-25-004952), and it is currently pending. A duly filed petition for judicial review to the Circuit Court divests the Planning Board of the authority to exercise jurisdiction in a manner that would affect the pending petition before the Circuit Court. Therefore, at this time, the Planning Board has no jurisdiction to hear this matter.

Based upon the foregoing analysis, staff recommend DISAPPROVAL of the requestor's reconsideration request.
