

DURABLE

1. INSERT DURABLE, FLAT BOARD INTO GROUND AND LEAVE PROTRUDING TO CORRECT HEIGHT.
2. REMOVE BOARD AND PLACE SEEDLINGS AT CORRECT DEPTH.
3. SPREAD DIRT OR 2 INCHES THICK LAYER FROM BEDDING.
4. SPREAD DIRT OR 2 INCHES THICK LAYER FROM BEDDING.
5. FILL REMAINDER OF DIRT BED TO TOP OF BOARD.
6. REMOVE BOARD & WORK SOIL AROUND SEEDLINGS.
7. REPEAT STEPS 2-6 FOR NEXT ROW.
8. REPEAT STEPS 2-6 FOR NEXT ROW.

- The spraying cloth and strips between 18 and 24 inches wide with a herbicide that is labeled for the grass cover being treated and all applications shall be done in accordance with the label instructions.
- The vegetation between the spray strips may be mowed or trimmed periodically, at late July and October, with the trees reach a size such that equipment can no longer fit between the rows without damaging the trees.

confined trees reduce windway roughness, can, wind competition and reduced heat stress. Methods may be applied around the tree centering for a radius 4' (96 inches) and to a depth of 20 to 30 inches. Mulching to a depth 60" deep at the trunk will likely cause no root damage, and promote root and increase tree stress. Mulch with untreated wood chips, (comp-mulch 4 months minimum) and maintain the 2 to 3 inch depth and keep roots dark covered. Because the large amount of this mulch is on project, the use of mulch to control overgrowing vegetation is not a feasible alternative. The site will be evaluated after the first and second growing seasons to determine if additional vegetative control is required. If determined to be necessary mechanical and/or chemical control will be done to

HANDLING SEEDLINGS

- 1 Seedlings will arrive as bare root stock. The trees shall be inspected to ensure good roots to top ratio and no damage to the packing material in transit.
- 2 Bare root seedlings may remain in temporary storage in a cool dark damp location for no more than 1 week before planting.
- 3 Container grown seedlings shall be stored in an area where irrigation is available and checked daily to determine if watering is required.

If planting of bare root stock cannot be completed within 1 week of delivery, the seedlings shall be held at site or transferred to container growing systems until final planting can be completed. The seedlings shall be inspected and checked on a weekly basis. The best quality – i.e., well developed root system and growth buds beyond which growth is likely to have begun and expansion of the above ground system will become a problem.

1. Plant new seedlings that be planted in _____, using two types of compost vegetation for a radius of not less than 9 m.
2. Flaming may be done with a _____, flaming fur, gibbs plants by digging a hole.
3. Seedling shall be placed in the hole ensuring that the roots are spread apart and the tree roots close to the hole.
4. The roots shall not be allowed to be closer than 10 cm apart and spread apart from the bottom of the planting hole.
5. The planting of the tree is not desirable and should be avoided because planting saplings causes damage to the surrounding forest and additional labouring that will hinder the growth and health of the tree. However, existing trees that are damaged or dead should be removed.
6. The hole shall be closed to ensure that the hole is in contact with all the events and that any soil particles are not washed away.
7. Thinning seedlings within planting is extremely important because of their size and the area with a handful of seedlings may be held. Thinning seedlings should be removed from the bottom or planting hole.
8. The seedlings shall be planted in the hole ensuring that the roots are spread apart and the tree roots close to the hole.
9. The hole shall be closed to ensure that the hole is in contact with all the events and that any soil particles are not washed away.
10. Weeding the tree after planting is not necessary for seedlings that be kept from planting such.
11. Matching a 100% radius area around the tree to allow for seedling that be kept from planting such.
12. Weeding a 100% radius area around the tree to allow for seedling that be kept from planting such.

Prunings

1. Limit pruning in the first two years to the removal of damaged and hazardous branching only. Branches are those that would cause personal injury, property damage or loss of sight when (most often) refallen in pedestrian or vehicular traffic. All pruning should follow the International Society of Arboriculture pruning standards for landscape trees.
2. The use of tree guards is prohibited.
3. The use of tree wraps is prohibited.

Waterings

1. Tree seedlings shall be watered⁴ with 1 gallon of water if plants⁴ are container stock. Seedlings planted as bare root stock do not require watering.
2. The use of a system that automates watering is encouraged. The system must be designed to prevent overwatering.
