Built in 1834, Brown's Tavern, also known as the White House Tavern, was a two-and-one-half-story, side-gabled frame building with an attached earlier kitchen building. The main block was built in 1834 by John W. Brown as a dwelling and tavern fronting on the Washington and Baltimore Turnpike. It was converted circa 1940 into the office and headquarters of a motel complex with 50 brick cottage units on its grounds. The tavern and motel units were demolished in 2001.
