

## **66-042 Old Town College Park Historic District** Roughly bounded by Yale Avenue, Calvert Road, Columbia Avenue, and Campus of the University of Maryland

Developed gradually, Old Town College Park retains much of its original grid plan as platted by Johnson and Curriden in 1889. Today, Old Town consists of 215 properties, made up of 295 primary and secondary resources. A total of 211 of the resources contribute to the historic context of the district, while 84 are non-contributing. Residential buildings make up most of the neighborhood. Primary resources include single-family dwellings, multifamily dwellings, educational housing (fraternities and sororities), religious, governmental, and social buildings. The resources date from the 1890s to the last decade of the twentieth century, with a single resource erected prior to the 1889 platting of the neighborhood (See 66-042-09). The buildings of College Park are generally set back from the tree-lined streets on lots of varying widths. Many of the residential properties have driveways to the side of the primary resources, several with freestanding garages at the rear.
