



68-010-02 Lewis Holden House

4112 Gallatin Street

Built in 1897 for Lewis J. Holden on lots adjoining the previously constructed dwelling of his brother, the Holden House is a two-and-one-half-story frame dwelling with an oriel window, paneled gables, projecting bays and a wraparound porch. The surfaces are enlivened by a variety of paneling. One of two houses of this design in Prince George's County, it was undoubtedly built from a pattern book design. (See also Historic Site 68-004-02.) It is a fine example of Queen Anne architecture.
