Laid in 1792, this is one of 40 stone boundary markers surveyed by Major Andrew Ellicott and delineating the boundary of the District of Columbia in Maryland and Virginia. The protective iron fence was installed by the Captain Molly Pitcher Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) on May 6, 1918.
