

82A-002 Pleasant Hills (NR)

7001 Croom Station Road Upper Marlboro vicinity

Built in the 1830s, with an earlier wing, Pleasant Hills is a two-story, side-gabled brick plantation house of the side-hall-and-double-parlor plan, with an attached front-gabled wing of earlier vintage. The main block was built for Zadock Sasscer; it is distinguished by an elegant fanlight and interior grained and stenciled doors. The house has been the home of the Sasscer and Hill families to the present day. It is an excellent example of transitional Federal and Greek Revival style domestic architecture with outstanding period trim. Pleasant Hills was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1980.
