



## **86A-012 Saint Simon's Episcopal Church Site and Cemetery**

### **Saint Thomas Church Road**

#### **Croom**

St. Simon's Chapel was a frame building with two vestibules and tripartite lancet sash windows in the gable ends. It was constructed c. 1894 on the grounds of St. Thomas' Episcopal Church Rectory, and was moved to the south side across St. Thomas Church Road to the present site in 1902. St. Simons Chapel was closed in 1964 and stood vacant until it was demolished in 1974. The cemetery is located approximately one quarter mile south of Saint Thomas Church Road. There are approximately 70 marked graves and an unknown number of unmarked graves in the cemetery. The earliest grave marker identified is dated 1929.
