Aquasco

Built in the early nineteenth century, the Wood House is a small, one-and-one-half-story, side-gabled frame house with facade-wide porch across the front, two prominent dormers, and an attached kitchen wing. It was built early in the nineteenth century, probably for the Wood family, and was later the home of Samuel Selby, who operated a local country store. Extensive renovations were undertaken by Selby's heirs in the 1950s, resulting in its current appearance.
